pring-cleaning doesn't just apply to houses. As the beautiful blanket of snow retreats from yards and roadways, it leaves behind not just a layer of blown-in soil, but debris of every kind. One slowly begins to see displaced items emerging from cover: torn plastic grocery bags, fast food containers, and aluminum cans, among other things.

Yards and alleys, vacant lots and abandoned buildings all reveal their collections, and the city begins to look neglected and dirty. With the same disapproval and vigor of a seasonally motivated housewife, Idaho Falls City leaders determined upon a plan, and the first annual Community-Wide Cleanup Campaign was born.

Mayor Jared Fuhriman has declared the campaign will take place this week from May 11th through May 16th, with all citizens participating to their level of ability. The Greater Idaho Falls Interfaith Council has taken the lead in organizing volunteer captains from each voting precinct whose responsibility it is to arrange for pickups and flatbed trucks, and for plenty of hands to gather and haul garbage. These captains will pinpoint areas of need within each precinct and will be available to help with loading and disposing of large items.

The city sanitation department is placing all available dumpsters around town to make them more accessible for neighborhood disposal. Flyers will be distributed to each home with information about what kinds of garbage go where, what can be recycled, and how to handle more difficult items.

It is hoped that each resident, in the city and in surrounding areas, will take advantage of this organized assistance to roll up their sleeves and help in every way possible. Each home and adjacent alleyway should be targeted by the homeowner. And where assistance is needed by the elderly and shutins, contact names are being supplied on the distributed flyer so that help can be sought.

This is an excellent time for families to establish their own recycling efforts, to clean up any graffiti on buildings and fences, to trim overhanging trees and bushes that threaten safety, and to dispose of items that are difficult to manage alone. The flyer will supply information about the places to dispose of appliances, tires, paint, batteries and other difficult items. Phone numbers and directions are included to make this as easy a task as possible, and every effort is being made to give assistance where needed.

Youth and other groups are organizing to help the City Parks & Recreation Department clean up parks and roadways, and to enlarge the army of volunteers in sections of town that have older homes, older residents, and greater need.

Occasionally there are household items to be disposed, that are in working order and still have years of wear in them. When these items are identified by the neighborhood crew leaders, they will be taken to the Development Workshop Warehouse at 2475 Leslie, and be stored there for distribution to needy families through the auspices of various service agencies in town who combine their resources in these ways.

Neighborhood crew leaders and their volunteer forces are encouraged to further share their efforts by encouraging the culmination of the cleanup campaign by meeting together in a backyard to share refreshments or potluck, and to fully realize the camaraderie that grows among neighbors as they link arms with each other for such a good cause.

This annual event will grow better each year as we learn more about our city and its resources, especially its helping hands. Sharing the load of beautifying our community will provide an energizing synergy that will raise this event to the level of a community celebration, stimulating the growth of friendship with our neighbors and a feeling of stewardship for our city.
