Every year since 1990, the citizens of Idaho Falls have partnered with local Rotarians and dropped 12,000 small rubber ducks in the Snake River for the Great Snake River Greenbelt Duck Race. Then for the next few minutes, you'll find grownups and children alike cheering on their ducks as they motor through the water at the lightning-fast pace of the gently drifting river. When all is said and done, a few lucky duck sponsors will take home prizes, ranging from a new Ford pickup to a 1.5-carat diamond ring, for having their ducks cross the line at the front of the pack.

The fierce competition—easily more exciting than your average NASCAR® event—takes place each summer for the purpose of funding the expansion and improvement of the Greenbelt. And over the years, it has brought more than \$4 million for the maintenance of the Greenbelt, a location that is cherished throughout the region for its clean and green splendor.

The celebration, which also includes a jam-packed schedule of car shows, drag boat races and redolent food booths (not to mention a half-dozen other activities), is sponsored by the Idaho Falls Rotary Club, a group that over the years has raised seed money for Idaho Falls' hydroelectric projects, helped refurbish the Colonial Theater, sent medical aid and supplies to Tanzania, aided in efforts to eradicate polio worldwide and contributed to earthquake and tsunami relief around the globe.

So no matter where you plan to be Aug. 11, make the call, sponsor a duck and make a difference for our community!

Here's How You Can Partner with Rotary

There will be dancing, entertainment and fun galore. Be on hand when the ducks are delivered with pipe and drums fanfare, and see the ducks get some pre-race exercise in the Porter Canal.
